

TIER 3 PUBLIC NOTICE

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for White Mountain Summer Homes DWID

Our water system violated drinking water standards over the past year. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 2018 to 2020 we did not submit results or sample in the timeframe required for the following contaminants.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly report during the last year; how often we are supposed to sample and how many samples we are supposed to take; how many samples we took; when samples should have been taken; and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

| Contaminant | Required sampling | Number of | When samples should have | When samples were reported |

| Maximum Residual Disinfectant Levels (MRDL)s | Every 90 days | 2 | October 1- December 31, 2018 | January 1- March 31, 2019 |
| Disinfection By-Products (TTHM & HAA5) | 2 samples every year | 2 | August 2020 | Samples were taken in September as they have been for many years prior. |
| Maximum Residual Disinfectant Levels (MRDL)s | Every 90 days | 2 | July 1 – September 30, 2020 | January 1- March 31, 2021 |
| Maximum Residual Disinfectant Levels (MRDL)s | Every 90 days | 2 | October 1- December 31, 2020 | January 1- March 31, 2021 |

What is being done?

All MRDL samples have been reported and DBP2's were collected in August 2021, during its current monitoring period.
